SUMMARY OF KILMELFORD AND KILNINVER COMMUNITY COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 9TH JUNE 1998

All Community Council members and 13 members of the public were present at the meeting.

Matters arising included: Speed restrictions in Kilmelford hopefully in place by the end of this year; Glass recycling - the Village Hall Committee had agreed to site three bottle bins in the Village Hall car park; Television reception in Kilmelford - Willie Wilson reported that whilst work is progressing, the BBC has still to obtain consent from Strathclyde Police to access their mast to enable electrical work to be carried out; Shore Cleaning Campaign - £365 was raised for local charities and it was agreed that next year's campaign should start with the three sections of shoreline which were not tackled this year.

Part of the meeting was spent amending the Constitution and Standing Orders for the Community Council. Neil Manchester volunteered for the position of Honorary Secretary and Jamie Mellor agreed to act as Honorary Treasurer.

It was felt that publicity for Community Council meetings was insufficient and that a better method should be found to notify the public of forthcoming meetings. It was proposed that a Kilmelford and Kilninver newsletter be circulated to include details of Village Hall activities, church services, parish and school news etc.

There was discussion about the need for and possible location of a playing field in Kilmelford. Grant funding may be available and several sites are currently under review.

A number of planning applications were discussed. David Kilpatrick had been approached for permission to site a cellphone mast in Kilninver.

The final item under discussion was the proposal from the Local Government Boundary Commissioners regarding possible adjustment of local boundaries. It was feared that the proposals would suggest the separation of Kilmelford and Kilninver in Community Council terms. Kilninver Councillors agreed to meet as soon as the plans were made public.

The next meeting will be held on Tuesday 29th September at 8 p.m. in Kilmelford and Kilninver Village Hall.
