RECYCLING FACILITIES

The recycling facilities at the Kilmelford Village Hall now cover plastics, bottles and cans. It is hoped that a paper bank will be added early in 2005. To ensure the continuation of these facilities, it is vital that they are used as much as possible (come on, it's everyone's social responsibility!), but most importantly, used properly. There have been examples of non-recyclable material left in the car park, notably an old mattress has recently been dumped next to the containers, which only means that someone else has to tidy up. Large items of domestic waste should either be taken directly to the council tip, or retained until the bulk refuse service returns (dates are published in the Oban Times and in Kilmelford Post Office). Please can everyone ensure that only the correct recyclable material is placed in the relevant container, and that no rubbish or waste material is left alongside.

KILNINVER AND KILMELFORD COMMUNITY COUNCIL

SUMMARY OF MEETING HELD ON TUESDAY, 12th OCTOBER, 2004 (Minutes not yet approved)

An ordinary general meeting of the above Council was held on Tuesday 12th October 2004. In attendance were 4 Community Councillors, 2 Argyll and Bute Councillors and 19 members of the public.

The matters arising were dealt with first: The issue of the telegraph poles at Blaran road end will only be resolved by a change in legislation, which Cllr Macaskill is currently applying for. There are still some concerns over the safety of school buses stopping at the road end, and plans are to be scrutinised regarding the re-routing of the access road. The school car park at Kilninver is sometimes overused, which prevents local residents from parking safely. The Community Council notice board has still not been erected. An application for a 5,000 tonne timber extraction licence from Scammadale has been rejected, as previous extractions left the road in a poor state. It is hoped that funds will be available for training sessions under the Argyll Biodiversity Partnership. The Scottish Executive is inviting tenders for broadband installation for rural communities. The current NHS consultation document had been reviewed, and was generally considered to be a deterioration in services for Argyll and Bute. The Argyll and Bute Council had objected to the proposals, but a new Solutions Group had offered a sensible way

forward, which was likely to be accepted by NHS Highlands. Scottish Power had not yet submitted a fresh application for the wind farm at Inverliever, but that a lengthy consultation process would follow. The matter of the proposed Loch Melfort marine park trust was discussed, and it was noted that the Crown Estate had refused to grant the lease of the entire seabed of Loch Melfort to the trust. It was noted that legislation is coming in to pass control of all fish farm applications to local authorities, thus allowing all statutory consultees to get involved at first stage. This will be discussed in more detail at the next meeting.

Various planning applications were discussed, and it was noted that the current draft local plan was being used to assess validity of applications, and also that previous representations to the draft plan, submitted by the Community Council, were taken into consideration by the planning department.

Other business discussed included: paper bank in Kilmelford would be in place during 2005; safety of the new bus shelter in Kilmelford was under review; the safety railings and flashing lights at Kilninver school would be reviewed; the organiser of the Argyll Voluntary Car scheme would be invited to address a future meeting; bus timetables were under review, and local views on suitable times were sought by Cllr MacIntyre (If anyone has any specific views on the current public transport timetables, please come along to the next meeting and let the Community Council know).

The next meeting will be held in Kilmelford Village Hall on Tuesday 14th December 2004.

Would those who would like to celebrate the New Year (or any other occasion) with fireworks <u>please</u> consider your neighbours with pets and/or small children and perhaps give them a call with advance warning? And please remember that it's an offence to set off fireworks after 11 o'clock at night.

CRIME ALERT

Just because we live in a peaceful, rural community, please don't be complacent about the risk of crime. Recently, a <u>local</u> resident was conned out of a large sum of money by bogus tradesmen. So, be aware!

There has also been a growing number of reports of e-mail confidence tricks targeting accommodation providers in the area, seemingly as a money laundering exercise. A variety of approaches are used, one being the offer of up-front payment of amounts exceeding the amount due followed by requests to either return the balance or send it to some unknown recipient. The Tourist Board is aware of these scams and has notified its members. A similar tactic has also been used locally on an unsuspecting victim when they advertised their car for sale.

There are also a number of e-mail/telephone scams on the go trying to elicit your bank details and/or full credit card details including the security numbers. Don't be fooled into giving these, however plausible the approach appears to be.

An excellent booklet "Your Practical Guide to Crime Prevention" is available from the Mobile Police Office where you can also seek crime prevention advice.

Note: I would like to assure everyone that, in discussing the above incidents with me, the police did not reveal the identities of the people concerned.
