#### FARMHOUSE FRUIT CAKE

Set oven to 140 degrees C (Gas mark 3)

6 oz. soft margarine 6 oz. soft brown sugar 4 tsps. marmalade 3 eggs 12 oz. mixed dried fruit 9 oz. self raising flour

Put all ingredients into a bowl and mix well (you can use an electric mixer). Put into a greased and lined 8" cake tin. Bake for 1 hour, or until golden brown and firm to touch. This cake is a good keeper and best made two or three days before required. Can be frozen.

#### KILNINVER CHURCH APPEAL

After an inspection of the Kilninver Church building serious problems in the roof were revealed. The Kirk Session decided that an Appeal should be made to the community of Kilninver and to those whose roots were in that area asking people to pledge their support for the restoration project in specific financial terms.

The original target figure was £22,000, and by the middle of February over £17,000 had been pledged. I am delighted to report that the figure now stands at approximately £18,500, and that nearly £5000 of these pledges has already been made over to the Appeal.

Applications have been made to various grant aiding organisations, and again I am delighted to report that we have received promises of three grants totalling £5500, including one of £3500 from the Church of Scotland General Trustees, who told us that they were making the grant because of the enthusiastic response from the community.

The Presbytery of Argyll, the local Church's governing body, has approved that the repairs be done on the grounds that funding should be available, and have given us their blessing on the whole matter.

All of this has given the Kirk Session and the whole congregation an immense amount of encouragement and the decision has been made to put the work out to tender. It might be some time yet before visible work is seen around the building - the roof work at one end cannot be done while a resident colony of bats are breeding or hibernating, and we must be able to engage contractors who are experienced in working on Church buildings.

What has delighted us most in all of this matter has been the enthusiastic response from the community, who have made it clear that while attending church on a regular basis is not part of their lifestyle, having the church and a church building in the community is of real importance to them.

Through the pages of the Newsletter, I wish to thank everyone who has responded so generously of time, interest and money for this Appeal. We feel that once the repairs are finished, the building should be secure for generations to come, providing a witness to the Church's presence in the Kilninver community.

#### KILMELFORD & KILNINVER COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION

Committee meetings were held on 18<sup>th</sup> January, 1<sup>st</sup> February and 8<sup>th</sup> March 2005. The main points under discussion were:

- a) Replacement of four of the heating elements in the main hall at a cost of  $\pounds 607$ . The fitting of a new lock in the front door of the Hall at a cost of  $\pounds 388$ , including the new keys.
- b) The need for ongoing fund raising was emphasised by the Treasurer in view of the expenditure so far incurred this year.
- c) Deidre Campbell-Gibson has retired as Hall caretaker and a replacement caretaker is being sought. This is to be offered as a salaried position, unless a volunteer can be found. In the meantime, the committee are working a rota of caretaking duties between them. Annie Saunders in Kilmelford Village Store is dealing with all bookings and keys. Robin Grey is collecting hire fees, some of which are paid via the shop.
- d) A cheque for £655 has been received from the Prince of Wales Trust for the Beach Clean done by local volunteers in April 2004. This money is available for projects involving young people. Additional committee members are being sought to help to promote these activities.

#### **RECYCLING FACILITIES**

The recycling facilities at the Kilmelford Village Hall now cover plastics, bottles and cans. It is hoped that a paper bank will be added in 2005. To ensure the continuation of these facilities, it is vital that they are used as much as possible (come on, it's everyone's social responsibility!), but most importantly, used properly. There have been examples of non-recyclable material left in the car park, which only means that someone else has to tidy up. Large items of domestic waste should either be taken directly to the council tip, or retained until the bulk refuse service returns (dates are published in the Oban Times and in Kilmelford Post Office). Please can everyone ensure that only the correct recyclable material is placed in the relevant container, and that no rubbish or waste material is left alongside.

#### KILNINVER AND KILMELFORD COMMUNITY COUNCIL

The last meeting of the current Community Council was held on Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> February 2005 at Kilmelford Village Hall, with 26 people present.

Matters discussed included the Community Council notice board, which had still not been erected although the chairman promised to ensure this was completed by the next meeting.

The issue of the unfinished bus shelter in Kilmelford was raised, and it was agreed that the council should be urged to complete these works to a satisfactory level at the earliest opportunity. Public opinion is sought to determine the ideal bus times with the community, and the possibility of a dial-a-bus scheme was discussed.

After lengthy discussion, a motion was passed whereby the Community Council would object to the Inverliever wind farm application on the following grounds:

- a) The application was outwith current planning criteria and was setting a dangerous precedent
- b) There would be an adverse effect on tourism
- c) There would be a severe environmental impact in an area of outstanding natural beauty.

Further planning applications by the Trustees of Andrew Sandilands, in the Scammadale area, were discussed, and it was agreed that the Community Council should object to the current application on the following grounds:

- a) That the recent application was on a site of local historical significance, and as such should not be approved without further consideration *(provided that Jamie Mellor obtains verifiable evidence of this statement)*
- b) That the Community Council is concerned with the number of applications from the one source, and that the proposed large scale development is not compliant with Local Plans.
- c) That the Community Council wishes to meet, on site at Scammadale, with the developers, representatives of the Planning Department and local residents, to agree an acceptable development area and scale of such development, to prevent time and money wastage on numerous, unsuitable applications.

The parlous state of the road between Kilninver Bridge and Kilninver School was highlighted, and it was noted that the Roads Department would be investigating this in due course. Details were announced of a proposed 20mph speed limit outside Kilninver School. It was agreed that the Community Council would support the proposal that the current full time 30mph speed limit should be retained, and that a variable 20mph speed limit, automatically controlled to coincide with school arrival and exit periods, was welcomed.

The chairman reported that he had received a letter from Susan Mair, Head of Legal and Protective Services, Argyll and Bute Council, in response to correspondence from John Christlieb over his position regarding attendance at Community Council meetings. The chairman noted that Ms Mair was merely restating her earlier views that a ban on Mr Christlieb's attendance would not be appropriate, but that members of the public were only entitled to speak at the chairman's discretion. The chairman noted that as such, until an apology was received, Mr Christlieb's status remained unchanged.

It was noted that the Community Council elections would be held shortly, conducted by Argyll and Bute Council. Nominations were to be submitted to Argyll and Bute Council by Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> February 2005, with Election Day on 7<sup>th</sup> April 2005.

The lack of parking space at the village hall was discussed, and an approach will be made to John Tilley regarding the hard standing area next to the fire station. Various roads issues were highlighted, all of which will be considered by the Roads Department.

#### LOCH MELFORT ANNUAL BEACH CLEAN

The 2004 annual beach clean was a huge success, and thanks to the generosity of Melfort Village, Melfort Pier and Harbour, Ardenstur Cottages, and the Argyll and Bute Trust, a whopping £850 was raised. It was a great effort by those who helped in the shore clean, and one that will be much appreciated by all those who enjoy the beauty of Loch Melfort.

The monies raised over the years have been used primarily to improve and support the use of the hall by local children, and especially the Kilninver School pupils. The Village Hall Committee is currently considering future projects, so it is vital that as many people as possible support this activity.

This year's beach clean will be held in early May- watch out for posters soon, and next time that you are walking, sailing or driving past the unspoiled shores of Loch Melfort, please spare a thought for the few who make the effort each year, and make a resolution to spare one afternoon and come along to help us!

#### **KILMELFORD FIRE STATION**

It has been a fairly quiet winter, thankfully, with not too many call outs. There have been a few shouts that we have dealt with, all of which, happily, resulted in no injury to any persons. Our fund raising for last year totalled £776.31 to be split three ways as normal to National Fire Service Benevolent Fund, Strathclyde Fire Brigade's Widows' and Orphans' Fund and to a local cause. On the subject of the local cause, if there is a local group, particularly for young people, who would like some monitory assistance, please contact myself or any of the crew and we'll see what we can do. This year's fund raising will commence, as normal, with the spring car wash which, provisionally, will be held at the fire station on the

weekend of 7th/8th May with the annual duck race and open day to be, probably, in early June. Watch out for local posters nearer the time for confirmation of these dates.
