KILMELFORD CHURCH RESTORATION APPEAL

PROGRESS REPORT NOVEMBER 2007

The response to the Appeal sent out in June this year has been remarkable. At the end of October one hundred responses had been received and the total reached was just over £26,000. On the strength of the pledges and donations that were coming in applications to various trusts and granting bodies were made and two grants have been promised to us – one of £6,000 from the Scottish Architectural Heritage Fund and one of £8,000 from the Baird Trust. Again, on the strength of the responses that have been made, the firm that carried out the work at Kilninver – Cumming and Company Ltd, Perth – have already undertaken to commence work here at the Church in May next year.

As well as overseeing the Appeal, we held five 'music' evenings in the Church during August. A number of local people, young and older, came together into the Church and made music together with readings and story telling for one hour on the Wednesday evenings, and their music was greatly appreciated by locals and visitors alike. These evenings provided the opportunity to experience something other than worship within the building, and to see what restoration work has to be done. Many people commented on the good acoustics of the building, as well as appreciating the music. These occasions produced unsolicited donations of over £300.

We are most grateful for all those who have very generously given pledges or donations; the Group and the congregation are deeply moved by the responses that have been made, and encouraged that the Church is so greatly valued by community and visitors alike. Major works will take place next year, and the future of the building will be secured for some time.

There remains a gap before our minimum target of £50,000 is reached. Those who have made their response will, I hope, be pleased with the excellent progress of the Appeal. For those who have not yet responded, I hope this will be looked upon as a reminder, and an encouragement to be part of what we see as a wonderful and praiseworthy effort.

We will be asking that pledges be redeemed by the end of April 2008. Because of changes in the basic rate of income tax, effective from 6th April, 2008, the amount of tax recovered through Gift Aid will be less after that date, by about 25%. Obviously, if you can make your donation or pledged contribution before the beginning of April, we will still benefit from the higher rate of tax recovered. This will help the appeal along the way very nicely indeed.

The Appeal Group realized from the beginning that our task might be very difficult in our little community. We have been very much encouraged by the responses made, and the granting bodies have similarly been impressed. Together we can make a final effort to bring about the much needed repairs and restore the church building to the standard required to maintain it for future generations.

DRAFT MINUTES

The last meeting of the Community Council was held on Tuesday 9th October 2007 at the Village Hall, but as yet approved minutes are unavailable.

It was noted that the A&BC Roads Dept had been active in dealing with various Community Council requests, and a number of actions were also in hand.

The chairman explained the status of enquiries re the lowering of the speed limit in Kilmelford, and that while it was national policy to reduce traffic speed in built up areas, it was the local council's responsibility to implement. This will be taken further with A&BC.

Nigel Mitchell and Lindsay Davies reported on a A&BC Planning meeting in September, and reported on the planning and consultation process.

Robin Asbury explained the status of discussions with Mr J Tilly regarding land adjacent to the village hall. In return for gifting a levelled, playing field area, plus amenity area around the cairn, plus additional land for extending the village hall car park ands recycling area, plus a woodland area for recreational development, the community council will support an application for seven houses on the shore field. After some discussion, there was unanimous agreement to proceed.

Various planning applications were discussed, although no issues were raised.

Items discussed under any other business were: bus stops between Oban and Kilmelford, and especially the Blaran road end; the rumour that A&BC intended purchasing land near Melfort Farm Bridge to widen the turning area, although Cllr MacIntyre assured the meeting that this would not happen; A&BC are trying to secure ground to allow improved bus stop facilities in Kilninver; a community council notice board will be erected in Kilninver; the council are to be notified of Japanese knotweed and Himalayan Balsam in Scammadale; various roads issues and updates to be taken up with Neil Brown of A&BC.

The next meeting will be held on Tuesday 11th December 2007 at 8.00 pm in Kilmelford Village Hall.
